Upcoming International and Canadian Human Rights Related Observances

December 1

World AIDS Day

World AIDS Day is held on December 1st,each year and is an opportunity for people worldwide to unite in the fight against HIV, show their support for people living with HIV and to commemorate people who have died. World AIDS Day was the first ever global health day and the first one was held in 1988.

December 2

International Day for the Abolition of Slavery

The United Nations' (UN) International Day for the Abolition of Slavery is annually observed on December 2nd, to remind people that modern slavery works against human rights. This holiday is not to be confused with the UN's International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition.

December 3

International Day of Persons with Disabilities

United Nations' (UN) International Day of Persons with Disabilities is annually held on December 3rd, to focus on issues that affect Persons with disabilities worldwide.

December 6

National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women

December 6th, is the National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women in Canada. Established in 1991 by the Parliament of Canada, this day marks the anniversary of the murders in 1989 of 14 young women at l'École Polytechnique de Montréal. They died because they were women.

December 10

Human Rights Day

The United Nations' (UN) Human Rights Day is annually observed December 10th, to mark the anniversary of the presentation of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

December 20

International Human Solidarity Day

The United Nations' (UN) International Human Solidarity Day is annually held on December 20 to celebrate unity in diversity. It also aims to remind people on the importance of solidarity in working towards eradicating poverty.

January 20

Martin Luther King's Birthday

The third Monday of January is celebrated widely in Canada and the US as acknowledgement the global significance and impact of Dr. King's work as a civil rights leader.

January 27

International Day of Commemoration in memory of the victims of the Holocaust

The United Nations designated January 27th in memory of the victims of the Holocaust and calling for a "remembrance of past crimes with an eye towards preventing them in the future."



Gender Identity and Gender Expression at York

Gender Identity and Gender Expression were included in the Ontario Human Rights Code in June 2012 and this has resulted with an increase in numbers of York University community members who contact the CHR to consult about concerns and questions that they have in relation to what these protections mean and how these will be advanced. As it does for all other protected grounds, the CHR staff work with campus partners to assist individuals and York community groups to address questions and concerns about these new grounds in a manner that values the dignity of these community members.

A recent collaboration resulted in a new protocol developed by the Registrar's Office for York University students who identify as Trans and want to change their official name in York University's Student Information System.
