In 1991, the Parliament of Canada established December 6 as the National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence against Women in Canada. December 6 presents an opportunity for members of the York community to acknowledge and reflect on the issues of violence against women as it remains a serious problem in Canada.


Acts of violence can range from overt acts of hatred, such as the Montréal Massacre, to sexually based offences for example sexual harassment. According to a 2006 Statistics Canada report, women and girls are more likely to experience certain types of violence and assault. Provided below are a list of statistics derived from the 'Status of Women Canada' website that demonstrate the gravity of the problem:

- Young women are particularly vulnerable to violence.
 Between 1997 and 2006, young women aged 15 to 24 were killed at a rate nearly three times higher than for all female victims of spousal homicide;
- Four out of five female undergraduates surveyed at Canadian universities said that they had been victims of physical or sexual violence in a dating relationship;
- The spousal homicide rate for Aboriginal women is more than eight times that for non-Aboriginal women;
- Immigrant women may be more vulnerable to family violence due to economic dependence, language barriers, and lack of access to resources; and
- Senior women are twice as likely as senior men to be victims of violent crime perpetrated by a family member.
