



A.W. Peet is a Professor of Physics at the University of Toronto. They hold a B.Sc.(Hons) from the University of Canterbury and a Ph.D. from Stanford University. Their research expertise is in theoretical subatomic physics, and their work in gravitational string theory focuses on quantum black hole physics and AdS/CFT holography. Their awards include a Radcliffe Fellowship from Harvard and an Alfred P. Sloan Foundation Research Fellowship. They grew up in the South Pacific island nation of Aotearoa/New Zealand, and have lived experience of misogyny, ableism, and transphobia. They were also co-awarded the 2016-17 Terry Buckland Award for Diversity and Equity in Education by the University of Toronto Arts and Science Students' Union.
